Day 1 • Check In Incheon Air relax hotel or similar class :

Incheon

- Upon arrival at Incheon International Airport, Local tour guide will meet guests on 09:30 am at Terminal 1 “ GATE A ” .

- After that, Tour will start with transferring to
 - Songwol-dong Fairy Tale Village
 - The opening of Incheon Port in 1883 led to the start of many foreigners coming into the area for settlement. Soon, it became a rich village and many young people gradually moved out, leaving the village in a state of stagnation. As such, a renovation project was brought about to improve the development of the village by painting and decorating classic fairy tales all around
 - Incheon China Town
 - Incheon's Chinatown is Korea's only official Chinatown. It is in Jung-gu and was formed in 1884. It claims to be the largest Chinatown in South Korea, and features an 11-meter high Chinese-style gateway, or paifang.

Nami Island - Garden of Morning Calm

 - Nami Island
 - Namiseom Island, most commonly referred to as Nami Island, is a popular tourist attraction and somewhat of a curiosity just northeast of Seoul. See where the drama 'Winter Sonata' was filmed on Nami Island, and walk through one of the most famous gardens in Korea.
 - Garden of Morning Calm
 - The Garden of Morning Calm is an arboretum located at the east of Seoul, in the Gapyeong district of South Korea. On 300,000 m², it houses 5,000 species of plants, some rare or endangered.

Mt. Sorak Everland - Seoul

- After Breakfast, visit

- Mt.Sorak National Park
 - South Korea's third-highest mountain. As you explore with your fun and knowledgeable guide, see why this UNESCO-protected mountain is one of the country's most popular destinations, named for its slowly melting covering of snow. In November 1965, the Seorak Mountain district was designated as a Natural Monument preservation area. Afterwards in December 1973, it was designated as a park preservation area, and in August 1982, as a Biosphere Preservation District by UNESCO.
- Shinheungsa Temple
 - Sinheungsa, sometimes spelled Shinheungsa, is a head temple of the Jogye Order of Korean Buddhism. It is situated on the slopes of Seoraksan in Sokcho, Gangwon Province, South Korea. Sinheungsa is located in Seoraksan National Park, and many tourists hiking Seoraksan up to Ulsanbawi pass by the temple on the way
- Everland Theme Park , enjoy 1 Day Pass with Safari World
 - Everland Resort entertains visitors all year long with various rides, festivals, theme areas, and Zootopia, perfect for a great amusement park. One of the park's most famous rides is T-Express, Korea's first wooden roller coaster, popular among young visitors. Along with its main attractions, Everland includes a zoo and water park known as Carribean Bay

Seoul

- After Breakfast, visit
 - Deoksugung Palace
 - Deoksugung, also known as Gyeongun-gung, Deoksugung Palace, or Deoksu Palace, is a walled compound of palaces in Seoul that was inhabited by members of Korea's royal family during the Joseon monarchy until colonial period around the turn of the 20th century.
 - Pine Tree Gallery
 - This 600-year-old pine tree stands at the entrance to Songnisan Mountain in Boeun-gun, Chungcheongbuk-do. This old tree, designated as Natural Monument No. 103, is 15 meters in height and 4.5 meters in girth. Its branches stretch 10.3 meters to the east, 9.6 meters to the west and 10 meters to the north. Shaped like an open umbrella, this pine tree has long been the symbol of Songnisan Mountain,

and has even been awarded the title of a Jeongipum grade official of the Joseon Court.

- Kimchi DIY with wearing Hanbok and Seaweed Museum
 - Learn the art of wearing 'hanbok,' traditional Korean attire, and discover how to make Kimchi during this cultural experience. Visit the Bukchon Hanok Village, Samcheongdong Road and Insa-dong Street, plus try to make Kimchi, wear a traditional Korean dress.
- Bukchon Hanok Village,
 - Bukchon Hanok Village is a Korean traditional village in Seoul with a long history located on the top of a hill between Gyeongbok Palace, Changdeok Palace and Jongmyo Royal Shrine. The traditional village is composed of lots of alleys, hanok and is preserved to show a 600-year-old urban environment.
- Myeongdong Street with Duty Free Shop
 - Myeong-dong is one of the primary shopping districts in Seoul. Unlike Namdaemun or Dongdaemun, many designer brands are sold in Myeong-dong
- Shopping stop at Herbal Shop , Skin Care Experience, Ginseng Shop and Cosmetic Shop

In the event Deoksugung palace is closed, will be replaced by other palaces
